#### BILSINGA SERVICE

Last April King was invited to talk to a team of doctors and dentists in Mexico who are interested in mission work. A team of 7 dentists are coming for mission service in Tamale in July. A team of 12 ophthalmologist will be coming to do eye surgeries in Tamale. The twelve doctors will rotate their visits with 2 ophthalmologists visiting every other month. This will enable us to treat and monitor more eye patients throughout the year.

God has opened the door for Alabaster Project in Dominican Republic to recruit Latin speaking missionaries to be trained and sent into the 10/40 window to work among unreached people groups. Antony of Frontline Missions is the point man in this effort.

At the end of the dry season just before the rains begin that is the time when there is usually a shortage of food in the northern region of Ghana. The little food that is available is very expensive and makes it very difficult for most of the people living in the village especially widows and orphans. This offers us the opportunity to show the love of Christ by taking the farm produce into the various villages to give to orphans, widows, the blind, and the handicapped. We are in the midst of distributing the farm produce. We have distributed food and money to the villages of Blisinga and Giza Gundaa and we have several more villages and institutions to deliver food to.

#### FARM HOUSE



The beginning of the rainy season in the northern region of Ghana is a time of great storms. One such storm destroyed many buildings in our region, including our farm house. The building has been restored just in time ready for the farming season which starts in June.



This is our ninth year in farming. King started with no knowledge at all of farming and gradually through the years, he has learned through groups and individuals how to farm. April, of this year he learned how to properly plow, harrow and plant with a cultivator from friends and supporters in Kansas.
