The mobile medical clinic that was donated last year is a blessing for those individuals who live in the remotest areas of the northern region of Ghana. Thanks to Almighty God, the medical outreach is a success! The clinic was met with much excitement and intrigue in one of the remote villages where only one Christian family lived. This family has withstood a great deal of persecution over the past twenty or so years. The Lord put it on our hearts to go and share the love of Christ with those who had not heard of Jesus. They had heard only that there is a religion called "Christianity". At first, our team was met with hostility, which was soon quelled by the Holy Spirit, who indeed is our helper. We thank God yet again for guiding us to use medical services as a means to share the gospel. After being examined, the chief and

his elders soon realized that they needed medical care, and they acquiesced and extended their hands to welcome everyone. It was a glorious outreach, and the chief and elders were invited to come to Bethany Village for future health services. It was a hot and grueling day, but one to be remembered for years to come as Christ brought victory.

Several prayed to receive Christ as their Savior. John, the only Christian in the village is going to follow up with the new believers, and we will start the discipleship program in



that village to teach and strengthen the new believers. The first patient we served in the mobile clinic was the spokesman for the chief. He is second-in-command, and he was very grateful and promised help in the future. This opened a great door for dialogue with the chief who was previously antagonistic towards Christianity. We spent many hours with him after the outreach discussing the merits of Islam and Christianity. He conceded that he has seen that Christians support and help each other and that his religion did not have this type of support. This has opened a great door for us to go back and share more not only with the chief but with the members of the community.

## WIDOWS AND ORPHANS

We love visiting widows and orphans for they are a source of encouragement to us. In turn we also encourage them to continue in their walk with the Lord. Many have withstood untold persecutions for decades from their communities as well as their family members. Many of our “mothers” (as we refer to the widows) have been a part of our family for twenty years. They pray for us daily, beseeching the Lord to provide everything we need to continue in our service to Him. We are so blessed to know them as their faith is contagious and one cannot spend time with them without the feeling that one has been in the presence of the Lord. Please remember them in your prayers, asking the Lord to strengthen their bodies to continue to be faithful to the end.

### DR. GOMEZ RETIRES AS DIRECTOR OF OPHTHALMOLOGY


